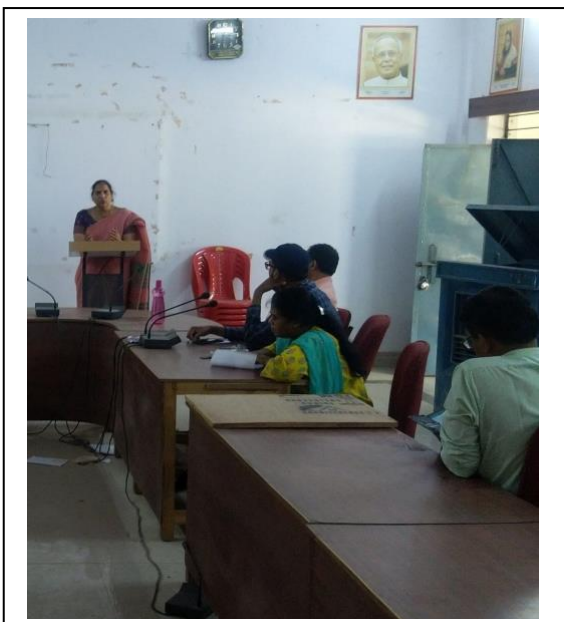

In this meeting in the presence of the Above-mentioned members the following points came up during discussions on the issue of Women empowerment:

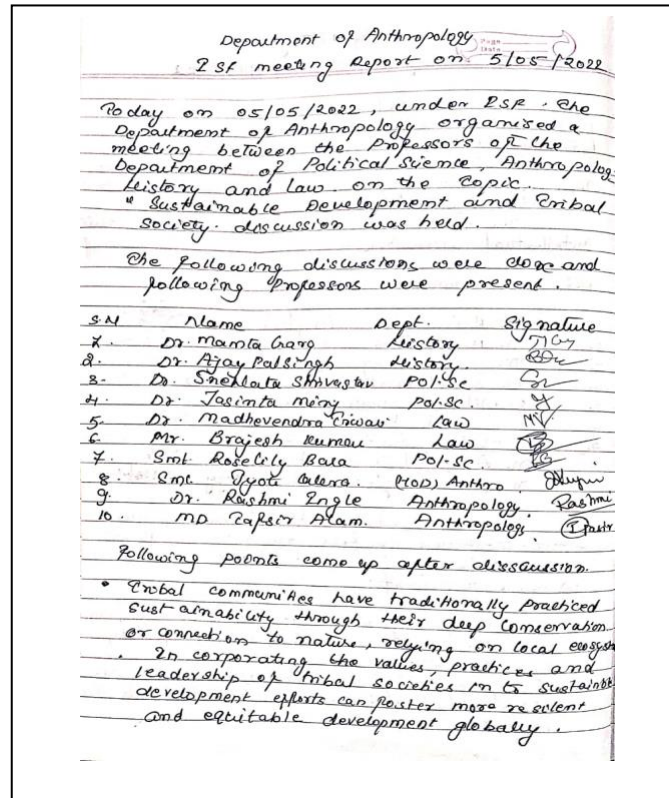
- Social equality will automatically come from economic, educational and Political equality and Capability.

On the basis of references, he explained the concept of climate changes and sustainable development by linking it with ancient Indian history.
